

INTRODUCTION

Eaton Square Mayfair Scholars lead in many areas of school life. Our scholarship process encourages and rewards attitudes to learning that will, above all, set high standards for others. Scholarships should not and do not reward talent alone but also take into account an individual's potential and ability to maintain a positive and proactive approach to all areas of school life.

Scholarships are awarded by the Head after consultation with the respective Head of Department and their tenure is subject to the Head's satisfaction with the holder's ongoing industry, performance and behaviour. If your child is awarded a scholarship, the usual value of the award is a 10% remission in fees.



ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Academic scholars at Eaton Square Mayfair take a genuine interest in the intellectual world and are passionate about learning. They have the potential to become the academic leaders within our School and the expectation is that they will perform at the top of their year group in an array of subject areas throughout their educational journey with us.

Our expectation is that academic scholars will fully engage in each lesson and encourage other pupils to achieve their academic best. Mentors of academic scholars work alongside pupils to nurture subject areas of particular interest, pushing them beyond the confines of subject syllabi. We are incredibly lucky to be located at the heart of this global city where opportunities to learn surround us. All of our teachers encourage pupils to fully immerse themselves in these opportunities.

Benefits of being an academic scholar:

- Regular academic scholars meetings which allow pupils to collaborate on projects and ideas, inspiring each other to achieve their academic potential.
- Academic scholar mentor (teaching member of staff) to meet with individually on a regular basis.
- Opportunities to take on academic leadership roles within the school such as chairing of the pupil academic council which aims to take on board feedback and ideas from pupils. These ideas are presented to the Senior Leadership Team to help shape the future direction of our school.
- Pupil mentoring from older pupils and an opportunity to be trained as a pupil mentor to develop leadership and mentoring skills for the future.
- Opportunity to observe teachers and feedback thoughts to encourage a pupil-centred approach to teaching and learning within our School.
- The opportunity to take short course GCSE's to further extend learning.



Academic Scholarship Process:

- Completion of an extended piece of writing from a choice of topics
- Interview with the Deputy Head (Academic)
- Academic assessment

CREATIVE ARTS SCHOLARSHIPS

Creative Arts Scholarships are offered to candidates who demonstrate outstanding talent in music, art or theatre. Eaton Square Mayfair is the perfect school for creative art enthusiasts with world class galleries, theatres and musical venues all within a stone's throw of our location on Piccadilly. We expect pupils who hold a Creative Arts Scholarship to continue studying art, music or drama for the duration of their time at the school. Scholars are expected to attend related clubs and competitions on a regular basis. They should be role models to other pupils and encourage further development of creative arts within the school.

Arts Scholars

Candidates will be asked to submit a portfolio of recent work with their application to discuss with a Senior Leadership Team member. This should include personal work produced in their own time in addition to work produced in school, clubs and holiday courses. Exploratory, experimental and drawing-based work, if only a sketch book, is welcomed as is imaginative, thoughtful and creative responses in a variety of media.

Music Scholars

Candidates musicianship and practice ethic will have a direct bearing on any award granted, and any successful candidate will be expected to play a full and active role in the Music department, including membership of the appropriate choirs and/or orchestras.

Candidates will be interviewed by the Head of Music and will undertake a musical audition and interview. The structure of the audition depends on the candidate's musical strengths.

There is the possibility for an informal pre-audition to take place where the Head of Music will be able to give guidance as to suitability to compete for an award. It also gives an opportunity to help potential candidates feel at ease and perform in familiar surroundings which may help them perform more confidently on the audition day.

For pupils entering our School at 11+, we would expect the minimum standard for them to be at on their principal instrument to be a minimum of Grade 4. For 13+, this increases to Grade 5. This is a guide only; the particular aptitude and musical experience of individual candidates are fully considered.



Drama Scholarships

Drama scholarships are awarded to candidates with potential, ability and an enthusiasm for Drama. Candidates will be required to participate in an audition which will comprise performing a two minute monologue or poem followed by a short interview with the Head of Drama. Candidates will be expected to demonstrate an ability to create and convey character, mood, atmosphere and emotion. Successful candidates will be expected to be fully involved in the Drama department, taking a leading role in House Drama, participating in the school's annual production and selecting to study Drama at GCSE level. Those with Drama scholarships in older years will also be expected to support lower school Drama clubs.


SPORT SCHOLARSHIPS

Sport is a crucial for building confidence, leadership skills, team spirit and self-esteem. It plays a vital role in the lives of Eaton Square Mayfair pupils, many of whom take part in sport every day of the week. Sport scholarships may be awarded for exceptional candidates showing outstanding potential in at least one of the following sports: Rugby, Football, Hockey, Netball, Swimming, Cricket or Athletics. Exceptional ability in individual sports may also be considered. Candidates will be required to produce a portfolio of their sporting talents to discuss with the Director of Sport.

We expect scholars to be role models to other pupils. Candidates must be able to demonstrate significant potential for sporting achievements at a high level as well as a willingness to learn, a positive attitude and an ability to provide inspiration and leadership to others. Pupils awarded with a Sports Scholarship are expected to represent the school in sporting fixtures on a regular basis and take part in our sports scholars performance programme. The scholarship programme's focus is to develop the athlete across all components of performance; technical, tactical, physical preparation, mental well-being, and overall lifestyle. At the heart of the programme is the notion of individual development within a team environment, supported by principles of long-term athlete development.

The Sports Scholarship programme will educate pupils in the following areas:

- Strength and Conditioning advice and programmes
- Nutritional advice
- Performance Analysis
- Functional Movement Screening
- Leadership and Teamwork Presentations
- Sport psychology mentoring
- Lifestyle and Time Management advice
- Individual performer improvement plan
- Individual Mentoring
- Working co-operatively with other affiliated organisations to facilitate and oversee completion of given programmes

ALL-ROUNDER

In addition to offering a strong academic profile, all-rounder scholarship candidates are expected to be able to demonstrate significant involvement in a range of co-curricular activities. They should be an example to others through their high levels of motivation and approach to all aspects of school life. Applicants for the all-rounder scholarship are usually assessed in two of the following disciplines; art, design, music, drama, academic, public speaking/debating and sport. HOW TO APPLY FOR A SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship application forms are available from the Registrar and should be returned, together with a fee of £50 per scholarship which is not refundable. Candidates may apply for a scholarship once a registration form has been received. Scholarship assessments will be conducted throughout the year and therefore early application in Year 6 is recommended. Candidates are welcome to apply for more than one scholarship.
